Child and Youth Safety Update

Scouts Canada has implemented several new policies to ensure the safety and well-being of the youth under our care. All adult members (both Section Leaders and Group Committee members) are required, before attending and assisting in Section meetings, to submit a clear Vulnerable Sector Police Records Check. In addition they are required to complete the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) training as well as the Child Youth Safety Training. These are provided through the Scouts Canada web site. They must also officially agree to Scouts Canada's Code of Conduct for adults.

In addition, any parent helpers who assist with meetings or at camps are required to complete these trainings and accept the Code of Conduct as well.

Youth safety is our main focus along with providing an enjoyable and beneficial program for our members.
